#### **Advent 2025 - Come Home for Christmas**

Advent is an invitation. Unfortunately, for many, it is the invitation to get into that Christmas spirit, to count down the days to the grand celebration on December 25th. The hectic day of opening gifts, sharing a feast, imbibing in some spirits, and spending time with your family.

But there is a deeper and more profound invitation being offered in the season of Advent. The invitation is to remember that we are heading for home. Or if we're not, if we've forgotten that there is a home toward which to head, it is the invitation to discover the home we call the kin-dom of God. It is where our faith-family resides, where peace resides, where justice abides, and hope will rise. Advent reminds us that we shouldn't be complacent about the way things are – not that we want to be-

come angrily attuned to every perceived failing in those around us or the world at large; but that we want to be a people who look forward to something greater, something more that is just on the horizon. Advent is the call to come home and be welcomed.

This year our Advent Worship Theme is called "Come Home for Christmas". Yes, I know it's not called "Come Home for Advent", but what I pray and hope, during these four weeks of Advent, as we worship and "Draw Near" together for daily Advent devotions, is that this will be a time to slow down and pay attention — not just to Christmas on the horizon, but to Christ's presence with us here and now. It's a season to receive God's invitation from our Sacred Text to "Come Home" to the hope, peace, joy, and love of the One long promised and found in the manger of Bethlehem.

And what this season of waiting and wondering teaches us is that Advent preparation is not all about Christmas, "the holiday"! We aren't about December 25th with all the jingle bells, Christmas presents, and tinsel. We are about the real Christmas, the celebration of the Incarnate One, who is born to remind us that we are not alone, that God is with us. This is a time to be reminded that we are about the longing for the coming kin-dom, where we will study war no more, where people will walk in the light, where joy will be found, and love will be the tie that binds us together. That's the home for which we long. That's the invitation this Advent season to your church and the world: to "Come home for Christmas." So, I pray you will draw near to the advent path of hope, peace, joy & love in our journey of coming home!

## **Trinity PNC Update**

Your Pastor Nominating Committee ("PNC") has completed the Ministry Discernment Profile ("MDP"), a big first step in the process of calling a pastor for Trinity. The information requested on the MDP required much thought and discussion in drafting responses that are accurate and reflect the broad range of Trinity's ministries. Trinity's Mission Study Report completed earlier this year was very helpful. Session has approved the MDP and the next step is approval by Missouri Union Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. We anticipate that will occur fairly soon.

The MDP will then be submitted to and posted on the Church Leadership Connection ("CLC"), a denominational service that helps match potential pastor candidates to the congregation seeking a called pastor. This allows interested pastors to inquire and potentially submit their information to Trinity's PNC. The PNC will undertake a training session with Missouri Union Presbytery's Executive Presbyter to prepare committee members for receiving and reviewing information submitted by pastors interested in the Trinity Pastor position.

Please keep the PNC in your prayers as its members do this important work!

- Session approved receiving a special offering on Christmas Eve with the recipient to be determined by the Mission and Outreach Committee.
- The shingled roof has been replaced at no cost to the church. A warranty claim was filed because the shingles installed in 2023 were not consistent in color. The Property Committee has approved a contract with Socket Fiber for internet service and new phone service. Repairs to the platform lift are covered by the warranty. It should be working again soon.
- Session approved several minor changes to the Child and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy.
- Session approved a new Gift Acceptance Policy and a Purchasing Policy and Procedures for Trinity.
- At the request of Stewardship and Finance, Session approved donating \$1,385 in February 15 Fund interest to the Voluntary Action Center for their food pantry.
