Mission Study Team Begins Their Work

The Trinity Presbyterian Mission Study Team began their work on Sunday with their commissioning service during worship. Brian Griffith, Cathy Holder (via online), Rob Humfeld, Chris Sheriff, and Susan Winkelmann all responded to their specific call from God by answering in the affirmative that they accepted this ministry of being on Trinity Presbyterian's Mission Study Team in confidence that it came from God! And that they welcomed the responsibility of this service because they are determined to follow the Lord Jesus, to love neighbors, and join in the mission of Christ. And you all as members of Trinity Presbyterian Church family confirmed their call and pledged to support and encourage them in this ministry!

So, it begins! So why are we doing this and what is it that TPC's Mission Study Team is supposed to do? Well simply stated, this time of pastoral transition is a great time for you all to consider who you all are as a church and to assess your ongoing mission and ministries. As reformed Presbyterians, we are supposed to be regularly examining our lives and practices and asking the Holy



Spirit to correct, re-direct, and shepherd us afresh on the mission to which God has called us. A Mission Study is a process and a tool that a healthy church uses to regularly clarify God's call and measure the congregation's fidelity to that call (*G-2.0301*).

To do all this the Mission Study Team has three primary purposes:

To review the church's current position honestly and comprehensively (e.g., demographics, financials, etc.);

To reflect thoughtfully and prayerfully on the nature of the church's context (neighborhood/city/country), especially how it has changed in recent years;

To hear what the Spirit is saying to us today.

In other words, 1) Who Are We? 2) Who Is Our Neighbor? and 3) Why Are We Here? Or, more precisely, "Why has God chosen to position us in this place, at this time?"

And to help in this process Missouri Union Presbytery has come up with Twelve Questions to answer in our study. The answers will provide a vehicle for the Mission Study Team to review the churches' strengths and weaknesses, and to prioritize what it feels is TPC's actual purpose. Plus, these questions help inform the search process for your new pastor.

To answer these questions the Mission Study team is presently reviewing and designing an all-church survey to begin listening to your thoughts about TPC in her mission and ministry as well as to listen to your dreams for the church and what opportunities the church might do to serve CoMo better. This survey will be available after the *14 Day Exercise in Faithful Listening* that we are asking **EVERYONE** to do. This discernment booklet will be available on Palm Sunday and will begin on Monday, April 21! Then on May 4th the Mission Study team invites **everyone who participated** in the discernment process to gather immediately following the worship service to listen to your thoughts, feelings, and insights.

Why is this important? Because all of the information gathered will be a part of a report to the Committee on Ministry. Also, your input will help the Pastor's Nominating Committee put together the Church Mission Information Form (church resumé) when that Search committee is formed. The Mission Study Team looks forward to journeying with you on this time of discernment.

Trinity Library Book Highlight with Marianne Fues, Trinity Librarian

The Insanity of God: A True Story of Faith Resurrected, By Nik Ripken

As a minister, Nik Ripken served in Malawi and South Africa before traveling to Somaliland to access the resources available to the people. Answers ranged from "not much" to nothing outside of Hargeisa, Somaliland. The people needed everything, so eventually he and his family established a NGO (non-governmental organization). A faith based agency in Somaliland would be a target, so they established their own international NGO in order to provide relief, health, and development projects.

In 1992, the United Nations committed ten military cargo planes to airlift supplies into Somaliland. Previously, supplies had been looted as well as store-housed in airport hangars. With an additional 25,000 U.S. troops sent to spearhead relief efforts, food was distributed to 50 thousand people a day. At distribution centers, people also asked for white cotton cloth so they could bury their children and relatives who had died during the night.

Ripken (not his real name to protect those who helped him) discovered that people desperately needed more than the help than they were prepared to give. They needed someone, anyone, to let them share their stories. Working in Somaliland required learning new languages, working around Somali clan militias, recruiting local staff, and sleeping through the gunfire and explosions.

Memorial Garden Upgrades Completed

The Property Committee is pleased to announce that Rost Landscaping has completed work on the improvements to Trinity's Memorial Garden.

As you can see from the pictures below, a stone retaining wall and expanded, paved surface featuring a tri-

quetra have been added. The benches have been reseated and drainage rerouted. Five oakleaf "ruby slipper" hydrangeas have been planted in the area under the cross.

The total cost of the project was \$23,700. It was funded primarily by memorial gifts and donations from congregational members with the remaining money coming from reserves, which will be repaid if additional donations are received.
