Michael's Musings


There is nothing like having a toddler around to make you question everything you think you know about words. During a recent visit with my family back in Richmond, VA, one of my niece's sons, Vann, was constantly mimicking everyone around. He was trying on new words for size, letting them emerge from his tongue just to hear what they sounded like in his own voice. I know that, day by day, his linguistic expeditions discover new lands and possibilities. On these journeys, he is discovering and creating a world at one and the same time. He is two and a half. But I have witnessed even 18-month-olds reaching out to the world in monosyllabic words of their own creation.

How do we even learn how to speak? We aren't handed a dictionary and asked to read it and get back to the adults around us. When we are less than two, we don't have adults making lists of vocabulary words with which they then drill us. We weren't signed up for language classes. As toddlers, we simply listened and tried. We simply experimented and mimicked. But mostly, we just saw, experienced and felt. We didn't learn this marvelous world of words so much as we lived into it.

And perhaps no word is more wonderful, more meaningful than "love." Few things are as affecting in this world than when my son or daughter at a very early age told me they loved me. And yet at two or three they could not have possibly understood what they were saying, could they? Does a two-year-old understand what love is? If I asked Vann what love is, he would only laugh at me and return to his toys. ...

In the end, we may find that in the light of God's love, we all are mere toddlers. We're not sure of the words we speak. We're not sure we know what we mean when we say "love". But we sense it, we experience it, we know it but not in the way we know that two plus two is four. God has planted love in our hearts and called us to share that love with all we meet. So, go out this Lenten season and try to love in new ways – even if you don't know what you're doing!

Highlights from the February 20 Stated Meeting of Session

♦ Sue Young presented information about House Bill 1708

which would allow people with concealed carry permits to bring firearms into church, as well as on public transportation. Sue also shared a list of resources on gun violence available through the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Session asked the Mission Committee to continue monitoring the status of the state bill and available resources for consideration.

- Approved changes to the stated meeting schedule for 2024. The May meeting will be held on May 14 rather than May 21; there will be no stated meeting in June; a moderator will be needed for the August 20 meeting.
- ♦ A change to the *Book of Order* of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) now requires all ruling elders to complete boundary training. The church has arranged for current elders on session to do an online course to meet this requirement.
- The Property Committee has approved a new playground structure to be installed as a Silver Award project by several girls in Troop 71765. In addition to the new play structure, the project will include preparing the plot, stair repair, and new mulch. The playground improvements are made possible by generous donations from several church families.
- ♦ The Stewardship and Finance Committee will host a Legacy Giving Presentation on September 8, led by a representative from the Texas Presbyterian Foundation.
- A memorial service for Norma Spurgeon has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 9, here at Trinity.

• The Mission Committee will be gathering more information about the April 27th ForColumbia city-wide mission day.

♦ The choir will present the cantata "Come to the Cross" on March 17 during worship.

<u>A Wakeful Faith: Spiritual Practice in the Real</u> <u>World</u>, by J. Marshall Jenkins
