



## Michael's Musings

Eleven weeks. That is what you so graciously gave me: eleven weeks to travel widely, connect with my passions, to rest and refresh. So first, I want to express my deep gratitude to you, the congregation of Trinity for allowing me that time of renewal. When I arrived at my hotel room at Giesbach on Lake Brienz, Switzerland, I was moved to tears. I was suddenly overwhelmed that all the work and preparation from the previous year and half was over. Here I was at last at an annual conference I had been wanting to attend for fifteen years, located in one of the most beautiful places on earth, with Janet by my side, surrounded by extraordinary individuals from all over the world. And this was only the beginning! Then came, Hamburg, Berlin, Wittenberg, Edinburgh, and Iona, followed by a trip out west to the Northern California Sierras, followed by a visit with extended family in Virginia, a retreat alone at Mammoth Cave Kentucky and finally a week off back in Columbia to allow me to ease back into active ministry at Trinity.

It was magnificent. So, you can imagine that I was clearly surprised and even a bit dismayed at what I discovered in early June as a clear inner resistance to reflecting on the events as they happened. After all, I am a preacher. Making sense out of it all is my bread and butter. Yet, throughout the summer, I found it difficult enough just to record the day's events in my journal, much less to try and interpret what I was experiencing while I was experiencing it in any meaningful way. I thought at the time that maybe there was just too much going on to make such concentrated focus possible; or worse, maybe too much time away from work and forced deadlines was revealing my natural laziness when I was alone and not directly accountable to anyone in any official capacity!

But over the last month since my return to Columbia, I have concluded that a more likely explanation is that something in me was telling me I would ruin the present experience if I was too focused on reflecting on its meaning while it was unfolding. Still, I actually began to worry that I might find it impossible to write another decent sermon or newsletter article ever again! A silly notion really. For, as I have returned and become slowly reacclimated to the work of being your pastor, my remembered impressions of my moments away and my reflections on them have come to me like a great and glorious waterfall.

Perhaps the lesson here is that there are some God-given experiences that are just too big to take in all at once. In fact, trying to do so, diminishes them. No, with some experiences, you just have to take your shoes off because you recognize you are standing on holy ground.


This fall, the Outreach Committee will offer the opportunity to join three groups:

### Highlights from the August Session Meeting



- ◆ joyfully received Dennis M. Grev into membership at Trinity;
- ◆ called a congregational meeting for Sunday, September 25 for the purpose of electing one elder to the Class of 2024 and four elders to the Class of 2025;
- ◆ approved a monetary gift for Ann Bouchard in appreciation for the wonderful job she did shepherding the congregation through the time of renewal over the summer.
- ◆ approved establishing an ad hoc committee of two members of the Stewardship and Finance Committee and two members of the Property Committee for the purpose of exploring the feasibility of conducting a capital campaign for building upgrades in 2023;
- ◆ approved the addition of Jay Bryant-Wimp to the Christian Education Committee and Sue Young to the Outreach Committee;
- ◆ received the following financial report from Administrative Assistant Ann Bouchard:

- ◆ learned that in response to a claim filed for hail damage a check had been received from Church Mutual Insurance in the amount of \$27,974.23 for replacement of the shingled roof. An additional payment of \$8,000-\$9,000 is expected once the installation of the new roof is completed.
- ◆ approved Elder Odell Newkirk to serve as the commissioner for the August 22 meeting of Missouri Union Presbytery in place of Elder Bill Daly.



August 17—bundles of shingles are being unloaded and sent up to the roof in preparation for the next day's job. We are still hopeful that the flat roof will be replaced sometime in September. A supply chain issue has delayed delivery of the underlayment which will be used.
