



Threads of Grace

As I reflect on the threads of grace in my life, I vividly remember the impact of the civil rights movement on my faith journey. Among those who inspired me was an early leader in that movement—Dr. Howard Thurman. Dr. Thurman was dean of the chapel at Boston University and became a beloved mentor and spiritual advisor for Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. King always claimed that it was Dr. Thurman who introduced him to the theology and strategy of radical non-violence. And that theology and strategy motivated me to participate in civil rights marches and protests while a student at the University of Tulsa and McCormick Theological Seminary in the 1960s.

Dr. Thurman's most highly regarded work was *Jesus and the Disinherited*, which Dr. King said had a profound influence on him and the strategy he and other civil rights leaders employed during the Montgomery Bus Boycott and thereafter. There's a passage in *Jesus and the Disinherited* I would like to share. It's on the theme of hatred and speaks very forcefully to the times in which we live. Dr. Thurman wrote:

Hatred tends to dry up the springs of creative thought in the life of the hater, so that his resourcefulness becomes completely focused on the negative aspects of his environment. ... A [person's] horizon may become so completely dominated by the intense character of his hatred that there remains no creative residue in his mind and spirit to give to great ideas, to great concepts.

As I seek to deepen my faith during this time of renewal I find the following prayer of Dr. Thurman particularly inspiring. I hope you do also.

For donors who might be interested in transferring stock or shares of other investments to the church in payment of their annual pledge or for another purpose, Trinity has two accounts set up for this purpose: one with Central Bank Investment Services and a second with Edward Jones. Administrative Assistant Ann Bouchard can provide you with account numbers if you want to donate in this way.

Online giving is available for making pledge payments or one-time donations. There are two ways to do this: 1) Download the free Vanco Mobile Faith Engagement app to your smart phone or tablet. When you open the app for the first time, you will need to search for Trinity Presbyterian Church, Columbia, MO. You will then follow the prompts to choose how you want your gift used—pledged, non-pledged gift, restricted gift (specify), building fund, special offering—frequency of the gift, and bank or credit card information. You can save your information securely so that the next time you sign in, you don't have to reenter everything. 2) Go to the church website: www.trinity-presbyterian.org and click on the "Give" menu option, then "Give Now." Scroll down a bit and click the "Donate" button, then log in or set up an account. If you have any questions or difficulties, Ann Bouchard will be glad to assist you.

The school kit bags are available on the front table in the narthex. Please pick up a bag or two and purchase the supplies below: (list is also included in the bag)


- One pair of blunt scissors, round tip only

Roof Replacement Delayed

The Property Committee had hoped to have a new flat roof installed in July, but the current unavailability of one of the main materials—TPO membrane—has delayed the replacement of the roof until at least September.

The roof will be replaced by Veritas Consulting and Construction, and they are working closely with the church to make sure Trinity does not incur material price increases due to the delay. The cost of the project is just over \$31,000. A deposit of \$10,000 has been made, with another 1/3 due at the time the work begins and the final 1/3 due once the work is completed.

Property is also waiting for a decision by Trinity's insurance carrier, Church Mutual, to determine whether Church Mutual will cover the cost of replacing the shingled roof which was damaged by hail.
