Thank you to everyone at Trinity Presbyterian Church who contributed to this activity by purchasing the required items for the kits, assembling the kits, and providing funds for the shipping costs. The kits were loaded 'on the spot' into the Church World Service van that was at the Sharefest on that day and will be taken directly to children who need school supplies anywhere in the world because of natural disasters, war, economic conditions, and other causes, or they will be taken to one of the Church World Service storage facilities to be distributed in the future when needed. #### For the Time Being by Annie Dillard

Annie Dillard, a Pulitzer Prize winning author searches for answers in her narrative. Why do we exist? Where did we come from?

This narrative surveys our world. Ten thousand terracotta figures fashioned for a Chinese emperor. The natural history of sand. The life story of Teilhard de Chardin, the French Jesuit priest/paleontologist as he crosses the Gobi Desert. The book ponders birth, death, existence, value, God and evil.

## **Highlights from the October Session Meeting**



The stated meeting of Session was held on Tuesday evening, October 21, at 7:00 p.m. in Room 12. The Reverend Kathie Jackson served as moderator. Rev. Osborn was on study leave. At the meeting, Session:

- ♦ approved renewing the charters for Scout Troops 4 and 404 and for Packs 700 and 2;
- ◆approved a 3-month extension of Rev. Osborn's covenant agreement (December 1, 2025-February 28, 2026);
- ♦ approved Chris Sheriff as Trinity's Facebook administrator (Ann Bouchard also has administrator privileges);
- ◆received a report from the Worship Committee that Rev. Kathie Jackson will preach at Trinity on Sunday, November 30, and Rev. Bill Young will preach on Sunday, December 28;
- ♦ approved \$300 in additional funds for the November 22nd Session retreat and approved the celebration of the Lord's Supper at the retreat;
- ♦ heard a report from Stewardship and Finance Chair Karen Neely that the committee had approved the purchase of new fund accounting software with an integrated data base for use by the Administrative Assistant;
- ◆received the September financial report: through September 2025 operating income exceeds expenses by \$65,202.62. September operating income was slightly higher than September 2024. Expenses for the month of September were higher than the previous year due to several maintenance projects.
