FROM THE ORGANIST: This carol “‘Twas in the Moon of Wintertime” is found in the *Glory to God* hymnal, #142. Jean de Brébeuf was a Jesuit missionary to the Huron Indians around 1640. He utilized images of their culture to help them understand the Incarnation of Christ. This may well be the oldest Christmas carol composed in the Western Hemisphere. Meditate on the words as you listen to the music.
