CONGREGATIONAL LUNCHEON AND MISSION STUDY GLEANING SESSION

Following worship in the Fellowship Hall

On Sunday, May 4, we will gather in the Fellowship Hall after worship to share our feelings thoughts, and insights from the "14 Day Exercise in Faithful Listening" which began on April 21st. Following a simple lunch provided by the Fellowship Committee, members of the Mission Study Team—Brian Griffith, Cathy Holder, Rob Humfeld, Chris Sheriff, and Susan Winkelmann—along with our Transitional Pastor, Ronnie Osborn, will lead us in a time of discernment. We strongly encourage you to be present for this session, as your responses and insights will help inform the writing of Trinity's Mission Study and the search for our congregation's next pastor.

Please be sure and bring the summary page from your study booklet on May 4 with you to the Fellowship Hall. If you can't make it to the Gleaning Session, please ask someone to share your thoughts and insights at the meeting. Each of our voices is important to this process.

The Mission Study Team is meeting weekly and has prepared a survey to be completed by all who worship with us. The survey can be taken online, and a link will be sent out on Monday, May 5th, from Hartford Institute to invite you to take the survey. PLEASE look for this email with the ending of @hartfordinternational.edu. Printed copies will be made available for those who might not be able to complete the online version. The Team will know who responds, but will not know how you have answered the questions. This will be another important opportunity for you to share your thoughts, concerns, and hopes for Trinity.

The Mission Team is also completing a complete church "Ministries Analysis" with the help of session committee chairs and the Administrative Assistant. They will also be collecting information from community organizations and with your help some thoughts from your neighbors, colleagues, and family members (Please see article on page?) After all the data is received, the Team will begin to draft TPC's Mission Study, which will then be reviewed by Session. It will then be forwarded to Missouri Union Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM) for review and approval. Once this step is completed, COM will then approve the formation of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

Please prayerfully spend the next few days completing the Faithful Listening sections in your study book, then join us on May 4. We want and need to hear from you about your hope and dreams for Trinity and your next pastor.



The Mission Study Team is hard at work assessing Trinity's mission and ministry as well as gathering a lot of important data and information to discern who you are as a church, who God is calling you to be as a church, and what type of spiritual leader and friend God is calling to join you all as your next pastor.

But as the saying goes, "it takes a village to do a Mission Study"! And that's where you all come in as members of TPC. The Mission Study Team are asking you (challenging you) to ask at least two neighbors, friends, colleagues, family members or a group you belong to a few questions. Then once you record their answers, return this information to a member of the Mission Study Team. It's important to note the WE ARE NOT EVANGELISING OR RE-

CRUITING PEOPLE TO BE MEMBERS. We seriously would love to find out how people in our Columbia community feel about religious communities, our church, as well as concerning issues facing us. So please take up this challenge and let's see what God is saying and where God is leading. *(continued on page 2)*

- The church calendar. This online version of our church activities calendar is always up to date. Just click on the "View Calendar Button" on the homepage and you can find out what's scheduled—not just for the current month but in coming months, too.
- The most recent worship service video. Just scroll down on the home page and you'll find the past Sunday's service. If you missed Sunday worship or don't use Facebook, you can always watch the service. (It just won't be "live.) You can also see past worship service videos by going to the "Worship" menu tab and choosing "Worship Service Videos."
- Other upcoming events. You can find information about upcoming activities by clicking on the "Upcoming Events" button.
- Online giving. Use the "Give" menu option, then "Give Now" followed by "Donate". Then set up an account or login if you're already set up.

Check out the site and let us know how we can make it better.

Dear Trinity Family,

Recently, several pastor colleagues of mine have shared that some of their members have been the target of church -specific scams. I think recently this has happened here at Trinity and has happened at my previous church. So, I'm writing to alert you about these increasingly common church scams and how to protect yourself.

How The Scam Works

Scammers impersonate me (or church staff) through text messages, emails, or social media accounts with messages like:

"Hi, this is Pastor Ronnie. I'm in a meeting and can't talk, but I need your help with something urgent. Could you purchase some gift cards for a church member in crisis? I'll pay you back later."

Or they have texted: "Hi this Ronnie, can you talk?" And if you reply they respond, Could you purchase some gift cards for a church member in crisis? I'll pay you back later."

These messages create artificial urgency and request unusual payment methods (typically gift cards) because they're untraceable. The scammer may use personal details they've gathered about you or our church to seem legitimate.

Red Flags to Watch For

- · Urgent requests for money, especially via gift cards
- · Claims they "can't talk on the phone right now"
- · Messages from email addresses or phone numbers **not matching** my official contact information
- · Requests that seem out of character for me or our church

How to Protect Yourself

First, know that I will never contact you asking for money or gift cards. Trinity has secure and effective systems in place to help people in need, even on short notice, and none of those involve me (or any church staff) asking you for money. If you get a message through an unusual medium, always verify directly with the church through known contact methods.

A Note About Our Directory

Our church directory is for community connection, not for marketing or solicitation. Please don't share it with those outside our congregation. When scammers obtain these directories, they gain names, contact information, and sometimes details about relationships within our church.

If You've Been Contacted

If you've received one of these messages, don't be embarrassed—these scammers are increasingly sophisticated. Please let Ann or me know so we can alert others.

Remember: I will never contact you out of the blue asking for gift cards or immediate financial assistance.

As Presbyterians, we value both community care AND thoughtful discernment. Let's practice both as we protect one another from those who would exploit our generosity.

- ◆ Approved the use of the sanctuary on Saturday, June 28, for a memorial service for Carolyn Doll, a member of Columbia's Religious Society of Friends (Quakers).
- ◆ Approved a motion from the Mission and Outreach Committee to allow a representative from the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute to set up a table in the Fellowship Hall on an upcoming Sunday with information about the Osher program.
- ♦ Unanimously approved a motion directing Rev. Osborn to draft a letter to our State Senators and Representatives in opposition to a section of a proposed bill (SB77) which would allow concealed carry permit holders to carry a weapon into a place of religious worship without the consent of the minister or religious organization.
- ◆ Received the March 2025 financial report from Administrative Assistant Ann Bouchard:
