I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. "John 13.34-35 (NRSV)

Do you love Trinity Presbyterian Church? So, what does that exactly mean?

Studies show that on average only 20 % of church attendees regularly contribute and are involved in the ministry and leadership of their church. While the other 80 % fill seats on Sunday but never experience the blessings of full church engagement.

Is this what Christ intended when he created his church? **No!** Scripture implores us, "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another . ." Hebrews 10.23-25

You see, we are called to do more than just come to worship on Sunday if we want to be Christ's Church. We are to firmly hold onto the profession of our faith and then think of ways to motivate one another to acts of love and good works. In other words, if Jesus is going to build His church as He promises, then we need to respond to His call to actively follow him in mission and ministry.

This year's stewardship series is intended to help us take a moment to reflect on Christ's call and think about our church and what we are doing here. It is my hope and prayer for us to celebrate, how for 67 years, Trinity has loved God and have motivated one another to acts of love and good works. And out of our gratitude for these blessings and desire for our church to love others for the next 67 years, I encourage you to generously respond to this year's Stewardship Campaign.

A great part of how we love God and others, as followers of Jesus, is the understanding that we are called to give of the resources entrusted to us for the work, mission, and ministry of God's Kingdom.

I challenge you to respond to the love that God and Trinity have given you by bringing a sign of your love (time, talent, treasure) to share with the church you love.

So, how might you demonstrate your love for our church? Could God be calling you to take a step toward tithing (10% of your income) by increasing your pledge? In addition, is God calling you perhaps to give more of yourself to the church you love by volunteering more hours to one of Trinity mission projects or serving the church in some other capacity? Or maybe commit to attending church more regularly?

During this stewardship season, may you firmly hold onto the profession of our faith by provoking one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together [regularly]! As you reflect on "Why I ♥My Church," prayerfully consider how God is calling you to share your love of Jesus, of Church, and for one another a little bit more this next year so that Trinity can be an even more loving, faithful and awesome church!


in Worship

The operating budget provides funding for

- special services on Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve
- weddings and funerals
- guest preachers
- guest musicians
- vocal and instrumental music
- communion supplies
- banners and vestments
- flowers
- maintenance of the audio-visual equipment and musical instruments

Included is the time the one preaching devotes each week to sermon and worship preparation, our Administrative Assistant and Office Assistant devote to slides and bulletins, our Director of Music, Scholarship Singers, and organist/pianist devote to planning and rehearsals, in addition to the maintenance of our audio-visual equipment.




We share our financial resources :

Through its annual mission budget, Trinity supports over 20 local, national, and international organizations providing care for God's people. We also generously support the work of Missouri Union Presbytery and the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) through our One Mission Undesignated annual pledge. In addition, non-budgeted opportunities for giving (both financial and tangible) throughout the year include special offerings—including PCUSA mission offerings, semi-annual food drives, Festival of Sharing School Kits, Christmas card tree donations for Presbyterian Children's Homes and services, and others.

At Trinity we have the opportunity to practice generosity in meaningful ways. When we give freely of our resources, we not only support the ministry and mission of the church, but we also reflect the love of Christ, who gave everything for us. Generous giving allows our church to serve others, nurture faith, and extend God's kingdom in our community and beyond. Each gift, whether large or small, is an expression of gratitude to God and a tangible way of saying, "I believe in the work of this church." Giving generously deepens our faith, unites us in purpose, and ensures that future generations will also experience the blessings we enjoy today.

WHAT WILL YOUR PLEDGE SUPPORT IN 2026?



The 2026 Proposed Operating Budget represents a total increase of 12% over the 2025 budget of \$374,004. The largest increase is in the Personnel category, which includes \$11,000 in search expenses for our new Pastor, the *maximum* salary and benefits we *could* offer an incoming Pastor, cost of living increases for office and music personnel, and adjustments to payroll taxes. A \$1,250 increase has been added to the Mission component of next year's budget. Utilities and insurance items have been raised based on rate increases.

Trinity Legacy Fund

The Trinity Legacy Fund may be used to: a) Offset operating budget shortfalls; b) provide funding for capital expenses when other resources are not available; and/or c) cover unexpected or unbudgeted expenses deemed necessary by Session.

It is the hope of the Stewardship and Finance Committee and Session that through donor gifts and sound investment practices the Legacy Fund will grow significantly over the next few years.
